Handbell Choir

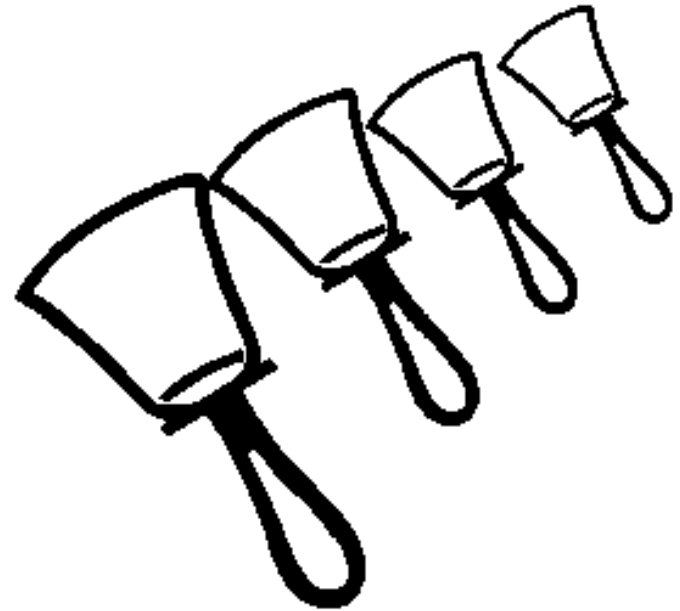
Yup, that's right. We're the only one.
