

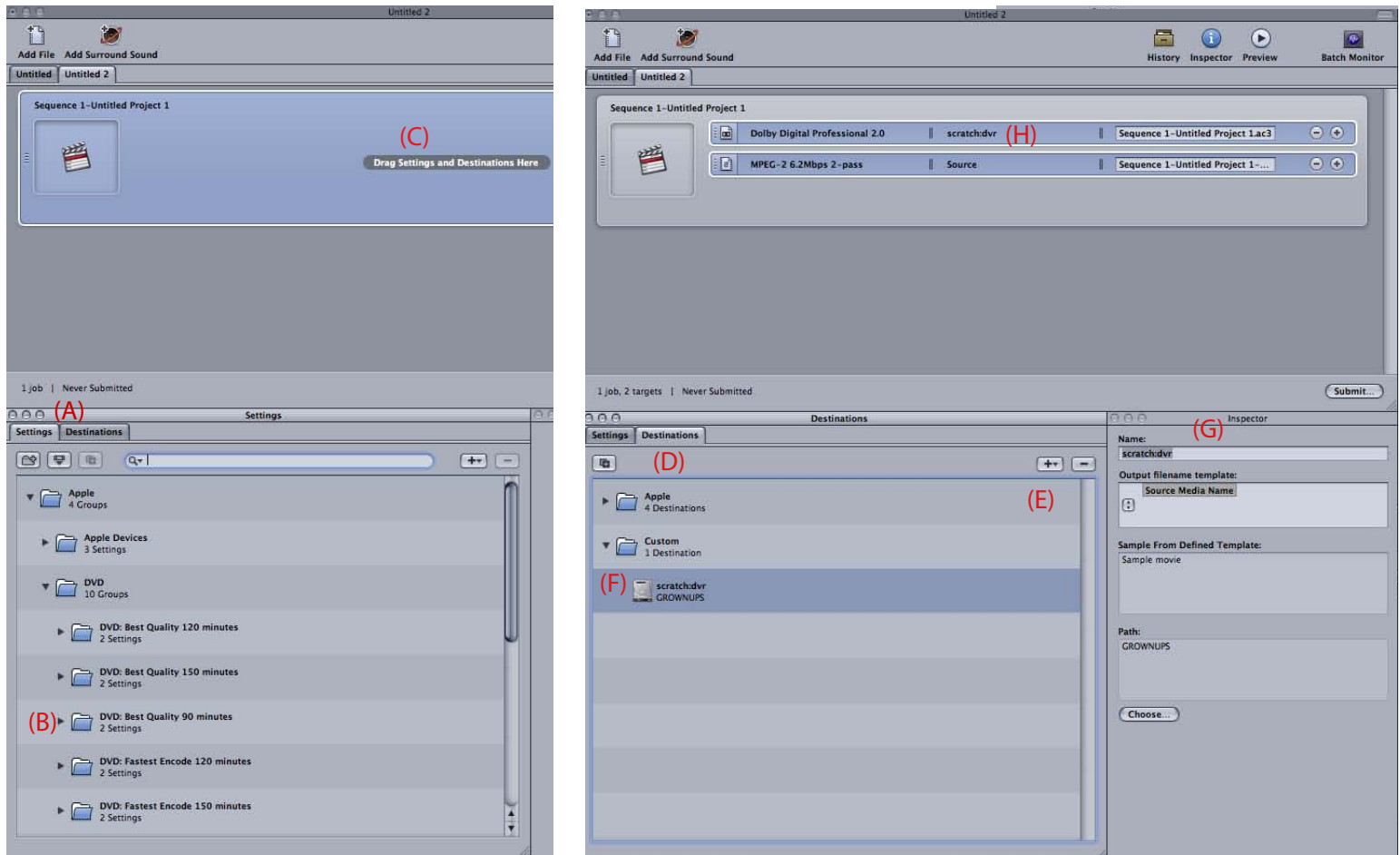
Final Cut Pro to DVD


FINAL CUT PRO

- 1) In the "Browser" window, click and highlight the icon of the sequence you want to make into a DVD. Make sure that you have removed any In and Out points in your sequence before exporting.
- 2) Go to the File Menu and choose Export-->Using Compressor...

COMPRESSOR

- 3) The application Compressor will open.



- 4) From the (A) "Settings" tab (located in the lower left hand window), drag the (B) icon of the "Apple/DVD/DVD: Best Quality 90 minutes" folder to the (C) "Drag Settings and Destinations Here" region in the "Compressor" tab.
- 5) Click on the (D) "Destinations" tab (located in the lower left hand window). Click the (E)  button and choose "Local...". Locate your user folder on the "scratch" drive. Create a New Folder called "DVD Source Video" and click the "Open" button. In the (F) Custom folder, click the "Untitled Local-1" disk icon. In the (G) Inspector window just to the right, activate the "Name:" field and change the name from "Untitled Local-1" to "scratch-DVD Source Video".
- 6) From the "Destinations" tab, drag the disk icon of "scratch-DVD Source Video" over where it says (H) "Source" in the "Compressor" tab. Repeat this step for both files.
- 6) Go to "File--> Save As..." and save your Compressor Project.
- 7) In the "Compressor" tab, click the "Submit..." button in the lower right hand corner. When the completed go to the next step.

TIPS

- If you shorten the file names, keep the names exactly the same as each other with their respective file extension.

DVD STUDIO PRO

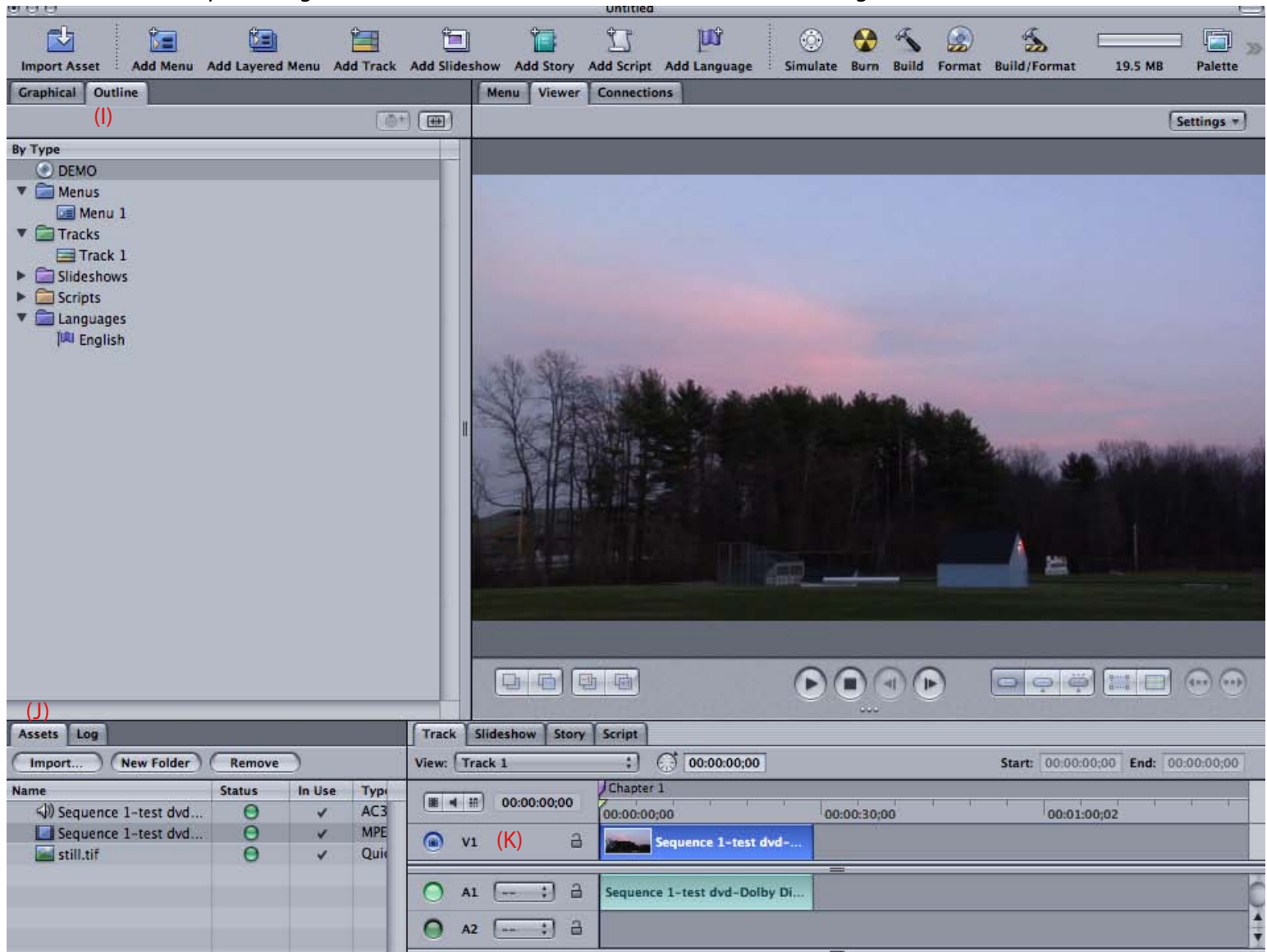
8) Open the application "DVD Studio Pro" from the Applications/Apple folder. If this is the first time you are opening DVD Studio Pro, choose the Advanced layout. If you have previously opened DVD Studio Pro, change the layout configuration by going to the Window menu --> Configurations --> Advanced.

9) From the File menu, choose Save and save your project to the scratch drive.

10) Click the (I) Outline View tab in the upper left hand corner of the Project window.

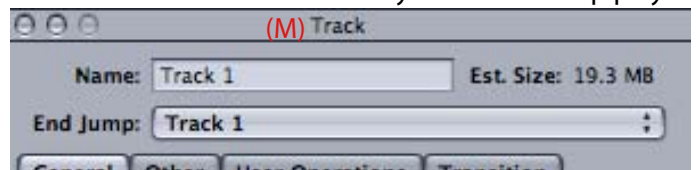
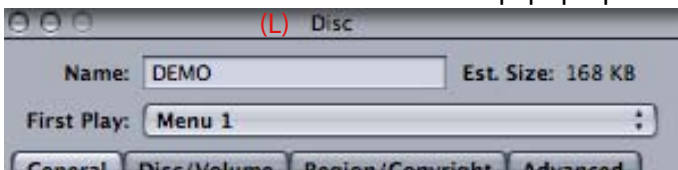
11) In the (J) Assets pane, click the Import button. Select the two files you exported from Compressor to import them.

12) From the Assets pane, drag the video file to the V1 track in the (K) Track Editor. Drag the audio file to the A1 track.



13) In the Outline View tab, click on the "Disc" icon. The Inspector Pane in the lower left hand will say (L) "Disc" in the Title Bar. Change the "Name" field to the title of your DVD. Then click the "First Play" pop-up menu and choose "Track 1".

14) Back in the Outline View tab, click on the "Track 1" icon. The Inspector Pane in the lower left hand of the screen will say (M) "Track" in the Title Bar. Click on the "End Jump" pop-up menu and choose "Track 1". This will cause your DVD to loop playback.



15) Save your DVD Studio Project. You can simulate your DVD by clicking the Simulate button in the upper toolbar.

16) From the File menu, choose Advanced Burn --> Build and Format. The Build and Format window opens.

17) In the Build and Format window, click the Source: Current Build: "Choose..." button. In your scratch/user name directory, create a folder named "DVD Builds" and then click Choose. Back in the "Build and Format" window, click the "Build & Burn" button. Stick your DVD in the DVD drive. The eject key is on the upper right hand corner of the keyboard.
